Is Your Home A Silent Killer Waiting For Your Baby?

You've prepared your baby's layette with love. Everything is perfect waiting for your new baby to come home from the hospital. The crib, sheets, and blankets are crisp and fresh for the newest member of your family. Above the crib, a mobile is poised to spin and lull your baby to sleep.

It's happened before. 20/20 even did a feature story on it.



One minute your baby is silent, smiling, and content. The next minute, your baby is crying hysterically, turning blue, and unable to breathe.

You rush to the hospital and the doctor's find that your baby's lungs are bleeding (a condition known as Hemosiderosis) caused by breathing toxic mold.

The moist and humid Florida climate is especially ripe for mold growth. **More than 70% of all houses tested in your neighborhood have been found to be infected with toxic mold.** This mold is very dangerous. It's Found Everywhere...

Mold loves to grow on things such as wood, fabric, leather, gypsum, fiberboard, drywall, stucco, and many insulation fibrous materials without you ever knowing. All molds require some form of moisture to grow however, like temperature, the amount of moisture varies for different species.

A deadly mold grows in places you can't even see - until it's too late!

And once mold finds its way in your house, it can spread everywhere, like a phantom killer, it migrates through your air-conditioner and walls looking for new food sources.

They Call It "The Baby-Killer"

Make no mistake about it. Toxic molds can be fatal! It causes many people to die ... and often ... even their doctors don't understand what it was that made these people sick until it is too late. Keep reading and you'll discover the doctors admit it.

The one mold to cause you the most concern is Stachybotrys. This deadly toxin is referred to in Medical literature as "the baby killer." News reports linked this toxic mold to the shocking deaths of seven infants in Cleveland, Ohio. In fact, Case Western Reserve Medical School summarized the horrific chain of events in Cleveland in an article, "Pulmonary Hemorrhage And Hemosiderosis In Infants."



If you have drywall in your house, which is normal for Florida homes, it could be a breeding ground for this deadly toxin. If you have ever had a leak or water damage in your home, the likelihood of finding it goes through the roof. It is normally found in houses after water damage and prefers to grow in dark places like wall cavities.

Stachybotrys grows on damp drywall. It is commonly found on drywall behind your walls.

You should be especially concerned if anyone in your home is experiencing difficulty breathing, dizziness, memory loss, chronic fatigue, hearing loss, urinary tract infections, gastro-intestinal tract lesions, depression, headaches, tremors, skin rashes or flu-like symptoms.

Pediatrics Magazine, published by the American Academy of Pediatrics, (Volume 101,

No. 4) recently recommended physicians check for mold as the cause of unexplained heart failure in infants. The sad translation of the medical talk is, after the baby has died then they find out that toxic mold was the cause.

This is what Pediatrics Magazine had to say,

"The growth of molds is pervasive throughout the outdoor environment. Given the proper conditions, molds may also proliferate in the indoor setting. Because Americans spend 75% to 90% of their time indoors, they are exposed to molds that are growing indoors.

Very little is currently known about acute idiopathic pulmonary hemorrhage among infants. This is a newly recognized problem and knowledge is expected to be evolving rapidly. In view of the severity of the problem, environmental controls to eliminate water problems and to reduce the growth of indoor molds are wise. Until more is known about the etiology of idiopathic pulmonary hemorrhage, **prudence dictates that pediatricians try to ensure that infants under 1 year of age are not exposed to chronically moldy, water-damaged environments.**"



The Threat Gets Even Worse...

The Next Most Likely Mold to Endanger Your Baby is Aspergillus. This is mold can be responsible for asthma, nerve damage, liver disease, lung disease, heart disease and severe eye damage. This toxin is so deadly; it was manufactured in third world countries as a biological weapon. The Florida Department of Health notes that mold can cause health risks, if left untreated. Yet, Florida legislators have not gotten any protections for homeowners or families out the door.

But that's not all: there are numerous problems that can occur in your home that lead to mold-creating condensation in places rarely discovered ... like your laundry room where moisture and heat accelerate mold growth, behind your walls and in your air-conditioning systems.

That means every time you turn on your air-conditioning unit, you are potentially spreading harmful mold spores throughout your home for you and your loved ones to breathe. When your baby comes home, their little lungs can't deal with this deadly toxin.
